Lucky 2B Here is a fundraising initiative set up by Ross Cowie of Portree who suffers from cardiomyopathy – a genetic heart condition. In Dec 2006, Ross suffered a cardiac arrest and his life was saved only by the very quick response of local ambulance crews, doctors, nurses and helicopter paramedics who happened to be in the vicinity.

The aim of Lucky 2B Here is to raise funds to help reduce response times, particularly in rural areas, and to save lives. This includes the purchase of specialist equipment and the organisation and provision of relevant first responder training courses, such as CPR. This is delivered in conjunction with the local ambulance service, nurses, doctors and the National charity, First Response.
